I am very concerned about the Rainbow group that will be in the Jemez mountains this coming week, up to 12,000 people in the Elk calving and a deer fawn area - Park Vernado, Rock Creek Mesa, Forest roads 103 and 69 up to 69 and road 70, the west side of Mining mountain.

I don't know why the Forest Service is letting them do there gathering there, one of the worst place to have a group that big in the whole Cuba ranger district. Stop this from happening. This is insane, There are other areas that would be less of an impact for this group to use.

I am a hunter and a life time resident who knows that area well, also I have spent time up there in the past few weeks and have seen a lot of elk, deer and there newborn. With this large of a group this many days right in the middle of there home it will push all the big game animals out and ruin that whole area for a long time and may take a few years for the animals to use that area for a spring newborn area again.

Also there has been a group of atvs driving every old logging road to make a path over burms or around them and remove fallen trees to open all the roads, this is what they said they were doing but would not say why, but would open all roads weather they were closed by burms or not. they are also making there own roads, which go through steams and down streams along the wilderness trials and ruining the whole area. To have atv trails and roads every few hundred yards all over the forest will remove all big game animal life, look at unit 6c where dirt bikes and atvs roam that whole area- and have disrupted a delicate habitat area for years now.

That whole area of thé south and east of the San Pedro Wilderness is a very délicate area, great habitat and should be protected some how.

Please work with the Forest service to do something about the large groups like the Rainbow group and the Atv and off road group that could care less about the impact that they all have.

Saturday, July 25, 2009 there were 9 vehicles remaining on site. Two were being worked on (transmission replacement on one, timing chain on the other). The last of the necessary parts had been delivered to the parts store in Cuba and had been picked up. The last of the water pipe was being wrapped and loaded. All of the trash had been removed and recycled or taken to the transfer station.

The interior of the site was growing back beautifully. The late afternoon downpours – called the 'monsoon season' here in New Mexico – has come early this year. This has meant that our crews have faced heavy rainstorms that last only a half hour or so. And that has soaked the ground, meaning that where we have scarified and duffed the soil, green plants have poked up and are growing abundantly...all native species. So in all the high-use areas there is already green groundcover. It's very beautiful. All the trails have been re-naturalized. And there have been waterbars put where there is chance for erosion. The FS has walked thru several times and I think they like what they see. All the items on our mutual list have been done.

When I left the site yesterday evening the cleanup was in its final phase: exiting the operating plan area. Everyone remaining was aligned with a vehicle. There was one cleanup community firepit and two small warming fires remaining. Heavy rains or something unforeseen could slow the exit down. But I think we have done a sweet job leaving Parque Venado and its surrounding woodlands.

NM Rainbow Gathering Cleanup, Friday, July 18, 2009

There were about 120 people onsite yesterday evening. Just about everyone was working busily on cleanup. Youngsters and oldsters moving over the landscape with the telltale signs of Cleanup Crew: a trashbag tied to the waist, falling apart gloves and a tool or bucket in hand. In the morning we had a family cleanup council. Folks came from just about every remaining campsite and we all talked about our various plans for finishing cleanup and packing ourselves out. There are five vehicles which either need help or have been abandoned. Pretty much everyone is aligned with a running vehicle for exiting.

The inside of the site is looking 'almost 100%.' Regular late afternoon showers have helped the high-use areas start greening up already. Most of the trails were disappeared and all the fire pits and kitchen areas vanished, scarified and re-duffed.

There is still population along the road by the trailheads and handicamp – where cleanup is still centered, but that is all planning to relocate to a different area so the trailhead/handicamp zone can be re-naturalized too.

On last Monday the 13<sup>th</sup> we did a long walking tour with the FS Resource Team and together identified areas that needed work. I'd say we were in agreement about what was already done to high standards and what still required attention. Except for what's along the road, most of the walkthrough's list has been accomplished.

There was probably less overall 'Trash': mixed bags that find themselves transported to the recycling areas than we've had in the past. And almost every one of those was opened, gone thru and sorted for recycling. The glass, metal, aluminum and #1 and #2 plastics have been transported to recycle stations in Albuquerque and the non-recyclable has been taken to the transfer station in Cuba, NM where we have made an arrangement to pay for the excess dumpster space used. Kitchens have set aside cases of unopened foods for the local food bank. Warm clothing and blankets left behind are being dried out, folded and accepted by a local service that can distribute these next fall.

#### **Travel/1-Way Route:**

The one-way travel route from the junction of Forest Road (FR) 69 and FR 70 west to the San Gregorio trailhead will remain in place until traffic flow decreases within the area. As participants begin to leave the area, vehicle and foot traffic is expected to be heavy along Forest Road 70, Highway 126 and 550, primarily within the Village of Cuba. Travelers are encouraged to use extra caution while driving.

#### **Parvo:**

There have been several confirmed cases of Canine Parvovirus or "Parvo" at the Gathering. Parvo is a highly contagious disease spread through dog feces. Anyone at the Gathering could potentially spread the virus through feces on their shoes. To eliminate the spread, and since Parvo can remain in the soil for 5 months or longer, it is recommended that the public refrain from bringing their pets with them if they intend on

visiting the Parque Venado area in the near future. Visitors hiking through the area should disinfect their shoes with disinfectant spray or bleached water before entering their vehicles and returning home.

### **Displaced Wildlife:**

Regarding wildlife displacement, although there may have been impacts to elk calving and deer fawning this season, the impacts are short term. Wildlife is instinctive and the four habitat requirements (food, water, space and cover) can be found throughout the area and in nearby San Pedro Parks Wilderness. The wilderness is comprised of several large meadows, intermixed with forest, and has plenty of good forage and nursery habitat (open meadows) for displaced wildlife. In past years, elk and deer were seen again in areas impacted by the Gathering as early as one month after the Gathering ended. Normal distribution of wildlife, however, may not be seen until next summer.

*This section of the 2008 Executive Summary that I pasted below describes the processes that the Rainbow Family used toward deciding their Gathering location. I am not privy to the processes that took place to decide on the 2009 location having not been a part of the Pre-2009 National Team configuration. Could you reword the applicable sections of this segment of the 2008 report to reflect what we should include in the 2009 Executive Summary? thx.....andy*

At the end of the 2007 gathering, held on the Ozark National Forest in Arkansas, the Rainbow Family held their "vision council" to discuss the location of the 2008 gathering. They voted to gather in Wyoming. The team's Special Use Administrator as well as the Washington Office

began communication with Rainbow Family members in the winter of 2007-2008 and a list of gathering locations proposed by the Forest Service was sent to Family members in early 2008. After that time, the Rainbow Family continued communicating with the Team's Special Use Administrator regarding their 2008 gathering location.

Specific sites for the national gathering are traditionally selected during Spring Council (late May or early June) after scouts visit sites around the area. This year's Spring Council was held **at Boulder Lake, a developed camping area about 20 miles southeast of Pinedale, Wyoming on National Forest System lands. This council occurred on or around June 10.** According to all gathering participants spoken to, this was the smallest council ever attended. The location chosen was Big Sandy, on the Pinedale District of the Bridger -Teton National Forest. This was not one of the sites offered by the Forest Service.

From December 2007 through June 2008 a series of phone calls were held between Under Secretary Mark Rey's office, the Forest Service, and Rainbow Family individuals. The context of these meetings was to promote cooperation between the Forest Service and gathering participants. Sites were to be offered by the Forest Service and information/resource concerns were to be provided to RFLI by the Forest Service. A list of 13 concerns with the Big Sandy site was given to the RFLI. Their interpretation of the list was that everything was simply problems that could be mitigated. In the future, if the gathering continues, it is recommended that everything in the future be presented to the RFLI in a black and white scenario, where there is no opportunity for interpretation of "gray" areas.

Although the Forest Service requires a Noncommercial Group Special Use Permit for every group over 74, the agency has the discretion with respect to enforcement of this authority. This year the Department of Agriculture through Under Secretary Mark Rey directed the Forest Service to attempt a different approach by not requiring the special use permit if certain criteria were met (for more specific information see page 3 of Washington Office, LE&I June 7, 2007, Employee Questions and Answers). Although most of the criteria/timelines for not requiring a special use permit were not met by the Rainbow Family, the Forest Service continued negotiating with family members and an Operation and Maintenance Plan was negotiated and verbally agreed to by a few individuals from the Family and the Special Uses Unit Leader on June 30, 2008.

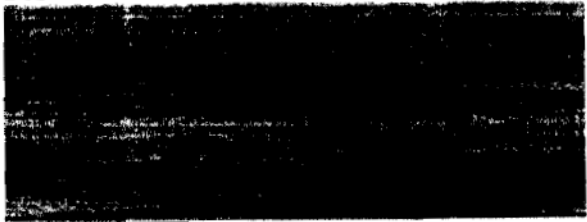

Would it be possible to add a line in there that the K9 units need to purchase from a Veterinarian a poison antidote drug in case one of the dogs is poisoned? We had dogs poisoned in the past. The drug we had this year was APO Morphine but they're may be other drugs we could use. The drugs only have a one year shelf life and should be purchased for each years gathering. Cost is about \$10.00 a pill. Should have one pill for each K9 unit.

Second comment / change would be to pg.9 in the AAR under #5: NIMT Configuration. The recommendation is to keep the NIMT Permit Administrators, I wouldn't limit it to just the permit administrator but to keep the same current positions of the National Incident Mgmt.Team. The point of a team is to have an established group that can get together and hit the ground running.

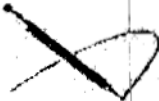
