### Rainbow Gathering Participants Vandalize Room at Frontier Motel – Cuba, NM

On June 21, 2009, Forest Service employees Sheila Poole and Tera Little were working the "trap line" to disseminate updated Rainbow Gathering information to the local community. They stopped at the Frontier Motel to leave an updated road map of the gathering site. Motel owner Timothy Herrera explained that one of his rooms was vandalized by three Rainbow Family members. Mr. Herrera mentioned that they originally just wanted to take a shower and he told them they would have to get a room. The next morning, the housekeeper knocked on the door to clean the room -- it was after check out time. When the three Rainbow Family members left, Mr. Herrera and the housekeeper found the room had been destroyed. The family members wrote obscenities on the wall, threw beer cans and cigarette ashes on the bed, night table, and all over the bathroom. Mr. Herrera said they called him some obscenities as well. He did call the local police who had just left before we arrived. Sheila and Tera were shown the room and Tera took photographs. The majority of the room was cleaned, however there was still evidence of writing on the walls and cigarette ashes on the furniture.
